Bridgman made his debut in 1863 as an engraver at the American Banknote Company, and later worked as a steel engraver. He came to Paris in 1866 and worked in Jean-Léon Gérôme's studio at the École des Beaux-Arts. He stayed in Brittany and Pont-Aven until 1871, then went to North Africa and Egypt in 1877, where he stayed for five years. He regularly took part in the Parisian Salons, like the Artistes Français, but also in London, at the Royal Academy and Suffolk Street. He was also present at the Universal Exhibitions of 1878, 1889 and 1900, receiving a silver medal at each of them.

Awarded the Légion d'Honneur in 1878, he was made an officer in 1907. He was a member of the National Academy in New York in 1881 and of the Société des Artistes Peintres in Paris.

His travels in North Africa and Egypt radically changed his palette, which became much clearer. A photographer himself, he often worked from his photographs, presenting a world of veiled women, richly adorned, playing with transparencies and white-on-white effects.

As well as these scenes from everyday life, he also painted historical subjects from ancient Egypt and Assyria, such as "Pharaoh crossing the Red Sea".

A cultivated man, Bridgman studied musical composition with Charles-Marie Widor, wrote several volumes on art, and published "Winters in Algiers" in New York in 1890, illustrated with his own paintings.
